## SILVER BAY YMCA GROUND BREAKING & DONOR APPRECIATION CEREMONY

**Silver Bay, NY:** The Silver Bay YMCA Conference and Family Retreat Center's Board of Trustees invites the public and members of the press to a ground breaking and donor appreciation ceremony for the construction of the new William Boyd Center on Sunday, August 6th, at 11:30 a.m.

The plans for the construction of the new \$13 million, 42,000 square foot William Boyd Center are currently in their final review stage with the APA with hopes to start construction this fall for a summer 2018 opening. The William Boyd Center, which will replace an existing facility, will feature a new dining facility, conference and meeting spaces, and 22 new guest rooms on the shores of Lake George. In addition to numerous private donations, the William Boyd Center will be funded in part through a \$4 million lead gift from Virginia (Rowan) and Manning Smith, long-time supporters of Silver Bay YMCA. The building name is in honor of Virginia Rowan Smith's great-grandfather, William Boyd, who was an early leader of Silver Bay and the YMCA. The remaining funds will come through a closed tax exempt bond offering through the Community Development Corporation of Warren and Washington County and will be secured by Glens Falls National Bank.

The ceremony will include a welcome from Silver Bay YMCA Board Chair, Mike D'Attilio, words from Silver Bay CEO, Steve Tamm, architect Mike Phinney, and a greeting from our special benefactor Virginia (Ginny) Smith.

"With the completion of the William Boyd Center, Silver Bay will be in a stronger position to expand its offerings throughout the year. This in turn allows Silver Bay to deepen its ability to have a positive impact on our local community, local economy and local environment. It will enhance our ability to fulfill our mission and our desire to ensure we make a positive impact on all those we serve." said Tamm.

The event will be held on the lawn of the Silver Bay Dining Hall. Light refreshments will be served. In case of rain, the ceremony will be held in Gullen Lounge located in Silver Bay's historic Inn.
